Emergency Loan Program (USDA)	Provides eligible farmers low- interest loans to help them recover from production and physical losses. Disaster Loans (US SmallBusiness Administration)	Working capital loans to help small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture, and most private, non-profit organizations of all sizes meet their ordinary and necessary financial obligations that cannot be met as a direct result of the disaster. These loans are intended to assist through the disaster recovery period.	Filing deadline for Physical Damage is on October 21, 2020 and the deadline for Economic Injury is May 24, 2021. Emergency Conservation Program (USDA)	Farmers and ranchers needing to rehabilitate farmland damaged by natural disasters can apply for assistance. Livestock Indemnity Program (USDA)	Provides reimbursement for producers up to 75 percent of the market value of animals lost due to adverse weather conditions. Livestock Forage Disaster Program (USDA)	Assists livestock producers who have suffered grazing losses due to a qualifying drought condition or fire on federallymanaged land during the normal grazing period for a county. Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (USDA)	Assistance for producers of non-insurable crops who suffer crop losses, lower yields or are prevented from planting agricultural commodities. Environmental Quality Incentives Program (USDA)	Assistance with immediate needs and long-term support to help recover from natural disasters and conserve water resources. Assistance may also be available for emergency animal mortality disposal from natural disasters and other causes. Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees, and Farm-Raised Fish Program	Provides emergency relief for losses due to feed or water shortages, disease, adverse weather, or other conditions, which are not adequately addressed by other disaster programs.
