Restoration Intern – Living Arroyos Part-time Hourly position Alameda County Resource Conservation District, Livermore, CA

Applications will be accepted until position is filled.

The Alameda County Resource Conservation District seeks motivated applicants ready for hands-on training to join our <u>Living Arroyos</u> internship program.

BACKGROUND:

The Alameda County Resource Conservation District (ACRCD) is a non-regulatory special district that works to support local preservation/conservation/restoration efforts on private and public lands. Managed by the ACRCD, Living Arroyos is a multi-agency partnership that includes the Zone 7 Water Agency and the cities of Dublin, Livermore, and Pleasanton. Since 2013, Living Arroyos has worked to maintain and enhance the urban streams and streamside habitats of the Livermore-Amador valley. The program creates beautiful, safe, natural areas that serve the needs of people and other living things through engaging the community in volunteer clean-up and planting events led by the Program Manager and Living Arroyos Restoration Interns.

POSITION SUMMARY:

Under the direction of the Living Arroyos Program Manager, Restoration Interns learn real-world stream management techniques that complement in-class learning. Interns are given hands-on responsibility for implementing habitat enhancement and restoration projects for the City of Livermore and the Zone 7 Water Agency through the Alameda County Resource Conservation District. As well as creek cleanups through the Adopt a Creek Spot program for the cities of Dublin, Livermore, and Pleasanton, Interns will also interact with and guide volunteers, gaining leadership skills and reinforcing their own knowledge by teaching others.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Work as part of a small team under the direction of the Living Arroyos Program Manager.
- Learn about the ecology of the Livermore-Amador Valley.
- Learn and apply stream maintenance techniques such as biotechnical bank stabilization and removal of invasive species.
- Implement native planting plans, maintain restoration sites and drip irrigation systems.
- Hand water project sites during the dry season.
- Conduct seasonal vegetation and bird monitoring.
- Train and lead groups of volunteers.
- Work with hand tools, and power equipment such as string trimmers, augers, and water trailers.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Curiosity, sense of humor, collegiality, flexibility, strong desire to learn on the job.
- Interest in natural resources management, restoration, and ecology.
- Ability to work on a team with diverse interests, backgrounds, and communication styles. Able to work independently and as part of a team.
- Physically able to work in the field (climbing in and out of streams, lifting ability up to 25 pounds, hiking over uneven terrain, planting) during all seasons.

POSITION SPECIFICS:

The Restoration Intern position is part-time, between 15-30 hours per week depending on workload and project need. The position is largely field-based and requires working outdoors on uneven terrain and in a variety of weather conditions. Project sites are located throughout the Livermore-Amador Valley with the base of operations at the ACRCD office in Livermore. Hourly pay is \$20/hour.
